

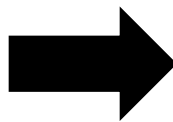

Whether you're willing to sacrifice your Tuesday to a wicked hangover or you want to limit your boozing to a few nights before the holiday, your best bet is this ginormous drunken trail. The expedition, which offers \$2 draft beers and two-for-one drinks at more than 70 bars throughout the city, heads out the weekend leading up to Halloween, as well as the actual night, to accommodate practically any drinking schedule. *Locations vary; visit pubcrawls.com for details. decadence of the Kit Kat Klub.
